

2008 LDAC recommendations

Government Enforcement of Existing Standards and Guidelines

- Get AI more active in State and Local government
- Create more state level professional coalitions
- Offer AI CE credit to attend state meetings
- Create specific education for CE versus initial certification
- Have AI become an active player in supervisor/trainee arena
- Have AI work more closely with AARO

What is your designation worth?

- AI needs to learn how to motivate Generation Y in order to get them designated
- AI may need to offer incentives to get mentoring going again in earnest
- Strengthen chapter guidance at the last steps of designation
- Have more offerings of designation track education and provide in more geographic areas

Innovation in Education

- Expand certificate programs to allow members ability to specialize (ie create "experts")
- Combine online with classroom education for more rewarding experience overall
- Partner with more universities across the country to promote AI education for students as well as others within profession for more competitively priced education
- Chapters should collect a portion of revenue from online education taken by their members to relieve the financial impact of this type education on their chapter. This would cultivate a partnership with National to promote their online education on a local level

Capitalizing on LDAC

- Have the Vice Chair of LDAC become a permanent position on Strategic Planning Committee
- Need to publicize LDAC more – many AI members are not even aware of what this event is
- Add a ½ day leadership training session to LDAC
- Have National committee chairs attend LDAC informational session
- More specifically target our lobbying efforts by simplifying our handouts to Congress
